Violinist, concert performer, artistic director of festivals and concert shows including in particular Capriccio Italiano Festival - Rome in the Sagrestia of Borromini in Piazza Navona in Rome, teacher and promoter of important cultural projects through the Luogo Arte Accademia Musicale of which she is the creator, Flavia Di Tomasso graduated from Santa Cecilia in Rome under the guidance of Claudio Buccarella and perfected, among others, with Domenico Nordio and Massimo Marin. Her carries out an intense concert activity in the chamber environment in an eclectic way, ranging from baroque to contemporary music and expanding her experiences in the theater field. She also recently oversaw the direction of the International Composition Competition Premio Musica Nova, of which Maestro Ennio Morricone was President of the Commission at the first and second edition. Among the many activities, in particular, she plays with the Mirabilis Ensemble and she is the first violin of the Luogo Arte Ensemble.

CECILIA IACOMINI

Graduated in violin, viola and chamber music. She has collaborated as viola in a row with several orchestras of Italian opera foundations: Cagliari Opera House, Sicilian Symphony Orchestra, Teatro Massimo "V. Bellini "in Catania, San Carlo Theater, Petruzzelli Theater in Bari, Rome Opera House, under the direction of G. Kuhn, D. Renzetti, H. Soudant, J. Conlon, Y. Temirkanov, J. Lopez- Cobos. She is a member of numerous chamber groups including the "Luogo Arte Ensemble" and the "Mirabilis Ensemble". She was a violin teacher at the Nucleo of Catania "Musica con Librino" of the "System of Italian Orchestras and Youth Choirs" (inspired by the Venezuelan "Abreu System"). She is currently a tenured violin teacher at secondary schools in the province of Latina.

LAURA DI MARZO

Soprano, born in Catania, she obtained a diploma in opera singing at the A. Corelli Conservatory of Messina with Maestro Antonio Bevacqua in 1996 and a second level academic diploma in Musical Disciplines with an interpretative-compositional focus in Singing at the O Conservatory. Respighi of Latina with Maestro Annamaria Balboni. He attended the Higher Education Course in Artistic Vocology at the University of Bologna Alma Mater Studiorum with prof. Franco Fussi and professor Silvia Magnani. She perfected her skills at the Accademia Internazionale Spazio Musica for singers and accompanying pianists in technique and vocal interpretation of the opera repertoire with Maestro Gabriella Ravazzi. She made her debut in 1998 with the role of Ciesca in Gianni Schicchi by G. Puccini at the Teatro Mancinelli in Orvieto; in 1999 she played the role of Carmela in Mese Mariano by U. Giordano directed by Stefano Vizioli. She also plays the roles of Santuzza in Cavalleria rusticana by P. Mascagni, directed by Massimo Scaglione; Donna Elvira in Don Giovanni by W.A. Mozart, directed by Beppe De Tomasi; Lola in Cavalleria rusticana by P. Mascagni, in the Theater of Viterbo, orchestra director M° Sergio Magli; Frasquita in Carmen by G. Bizet, in the Teatro D'Annunzio in Latina; Amelia in A Masquerade Ball by G. Verdi; Fiordiligi in Cosi fan tutte by W.A. Mozart, directed by Paolo Miccichè; Floria Tosca in Tosca by G. Puccini; Donna Anna again in Don Giovanni by W.A. Mozart. He performs in vocal and/or instrumental ensembles in various Italian cities, performing music from the chamber-vocal repertoire including the Folk Songs by L. Berio, the Siete canciones populares españolas by M. De Falla and other authors such as: G. Frescobaldi, J. Dowland, A. Vivaldi, H. Berlioz, F. Schubert, R. Schumann, R. Strauss, G. Fauré, P.I. Tchaikovsky, S. Rachmaninov, J. Rodrigo, A. Ginastera, M. Castelnuovo-Tedesco, O. Respighi, F.P. Tosti, G.F. Ghedini, G. Gershwin, K. Weill, H. Villa-Lobos, A. Piazzolla, E. Cordero, G. Petrassi, S. Sciarrino. He has won numerous prizes such as: the Napoleone Annovazzi Voce Verdiana Special Prize in 2005; the Award for best 19th century Italian interpreter in 2005; the Giacomo Puccini special prize for best Puccini voice in 2008; the Pavoncella Female Creativity Award for Musical Creativity in 2013; Virginia Zeani International Opera Competition, 3rd place in 2016; International Music Competition in Italy, 2nd prize in July 2019.

ANNA CARA

Anna Cara began studying classical guitar under the guidance of illustrious people masters, among which the well-known Mario Gangi tands out. His dedication and talent have been evident ever since from the early years, culminating brilliantly with the old man's raduation in 1966 sorting in Classical Guitar. Throughout his career, he has constantly strived for excellence, participating in numerous courses of high perfection with internationally renowned masters such as Alberto Ponce, Eduardo Fernandez and Roland Dyens. His continuous pursuit of perfection has reached a new peak in March 2011, when he obtained a second level degree in Classical Guitar. Starting in 2000, he began his career as a music and guitar teacher, obtaining the qualifications in the relevant competition classes. Since 2006, she has dedicated herself to teaching at the public secondary school, earning tenure and becoming one reference figure for students. His passion for flamenco music opened a new chapter in his artistic career. Animated by the desire to explore new horizons, she began studying flamenco guitar under the guidance of maestro Juan Lorenzo. His commitment and dedication went further manifested through improvement with prestigious masters such as Andres Batista, Javier Conde and Manolo Franco. The culmination of this journey was reached in March 2023, when it achieved a second level degree in flamenco guitar with top marks.

ELVIRA MARIA IANNUZZI

He began studying opera singing in 1989, under the guidance of Leila Bersiani, subsequently continuing his studies with Mirella Parutto and Franca Como, he also attended specialization courses in opera singing and repertoire in Spain with Carlos Chauson and Carmen Bustamante, completing his technical refinement with the Catalan mezzo-soprano Francesca Roig, perfecting himself with her in the Catalan repertoire from the 19th century to the present day. In Italy he continues his study of the chamber repertoire under the guidance of the mezzo-soprano Chiarastella Onorati. For several years he has passionately dedicated himself to the lieder and chamber repertoire, in fact he collaborates with various instrumental ensembles performing in concert pieces by F. Schubert, R. Schumann, J. Brahms, C. Wieck, F. Liszt, H. Wolf, J Massenet, R. Strauss, G. Verdi, R. Wagner, F. P. Tosti, J. B. Kalliwoda, O. Respighi, F. Malipiero, M. Ortega, X. Montsalvatge, F. Mompou, E. Toldrà and others. In particular, since 2009, in duo with M. Alessandro d'Agostini, she has developed a rich and interesting chamber music curriculum, characterized by constant musical research which leads her to explore repertoires often unjustly neglected and forgotten, composed in themed programmes. She is the author of the shows "Canto d'anime - portrait of a man", on the life and chamber music production of Giacomo Puccini (2017) and "Le voci di Clara" (2019) on the life of the pianist and composer Clara Wieck; both shows continue to receive unanimous acclaim from critics and audiences.

FRANCESCO DEL FRA

He graduated in piano at the age of twenty-two at the "L. Refice" of Frosinone with full marks under the guidance of Prof. Grazia Barbanera. Fascinated by chamber music, in 2005 he obtained the relevant three-year diploma at the Conservatory of S. Cecilia, under the guidance of masters Luciano Cerroni and Aldo D'Amico. Together with the clarinettist Vincenzo Isaia, he founded the "Duo Résonance", winning prizes in numerous national and international competitions. In 2009 he brilliantly obtained the diploma from the specialization course held by Maestro Bruno Canino in Chamber Music at the Fiesole School of Music, and since then he has performed regularly in Italian Chamber Music festivals and seasons, collaborating with composers and artists of international fame. At the same time he directs choral ensembles and takes care of the staging of "Tosca", "Madama Butterfly", "Un Ballo in Maschera" and other titles produced by the Dodekachordon cultural association, of which he has been founder and artistic director since 2009. He is the creator of innovative and experimental projects such as "Cavalleria Metropolitana", a theatrical and musical reworking of "Cavalleria rusticana" by Verga-Mascagni, and of educational and workshop projects for schools. He is a founding member of the Consorzio Liberi Musicisti, a working group that unites performers and composers with the aim of promoting contemporary Italian music. He is the dedicatee of original music composed by living authors and performs as a chamber pianist in contemporary music festivals such as "II Yard International delle Arti" in Montepulciano or "Contrasti" in Trento. He followed chamber music master classes with Calogero Palermo, Karl Leister, Piero Rattalino, Roberto Prosseda. He collaborated with the Italian Army Band as an assistant pianist. He is a frequent guest of the "Roman Music Chamber" and "Luminaria" season in Rome.

BARBARA DI MARIO

Graduated in piano and harpsichord, specializing with Sergio Cafaro and Eugenio De Rosa for the piano, with M. Clotilde Sieni and Barbara Vignanelli for the harpsichord. He wins a scholarship for the best graduates of the Frosinone Music Conservatory and one in ancient music at the School of High Musical Specialization in Saluzzo (CN), where he studies with J. Christensen. She specialized in chamber music with L. Pietrocini and M. Fiorentini at the Arts Academy in Rome. He participated in productions for the Euro Mediterranean Festival Association, for the Frosinone Music Conservatory including "Le nozze di Figaro" as harpsichord master. For the Franco Maria Saraceni Choir Association of Rome, he performed the concertos for two harpsichords by J.S. Bach with M. Clotilde Sieni. For the Teatro di Gioia Festival (AQ) with the artistic direction of Dacia Maraini, he performed various original works by Grimoaldo Macchia. He is a member of the Ensemble Delectare Musicando with which, among other things, he published a CD "I fantastic five", he collaborates regularly with the Decima Sinfonia Choir of Pescasseroli directed by Annatranquilla Neri and, since 2012, he has been a member of the Trio Solaris.

SIMONE SALVATORI: guitar



PROGRAM:

Il progetto nasce con l'obiettivo di far convivere all'interno di un'esibizione musicale alcuni tra i più importanti temi della tradizione operistica italiana (Giuseppe Verdi e Gioacchino Rossini), tradotti egregiamente sulla chitarra da J. Arcas e M. Giuliani, contratti di virtuosismo e romanticismo, (tipici e sempre presenti nella musica di Niccolò Paganini e Giulio Regondi).

The project was born with the aim of bringing together some of the most important themes of the Italian operatic tradition (Giuseppe Verdi and Gioacchino Rossini) within a musical performance, excellently translated onto the guitar by J. Arcas and M. Giuliani, contracts of virtuosity and romanticism, (typical and always present in the music of Niccolò Paganini and Giulio Regondi).

SIMONE SALVATORI

Born in Latina on 6 May 1992, today he performs at festivals, reviews and musical seasons as a soloist and in chamber ensembles, presenting different programs ranging from ancient to contemporary music. In 2016 he reached the stage of the second level diploma, awarded with a 110 cum laude with honorable mention, at the L. Refice Conservatory in Frosinone. This is then followed by further training at the Accademia S. Strata in Pisa with Aniello Desiderio, in Livorno with Roland Dyens and in Rome with Carlo Marchione. He obtained several scholarships: he was awarded as best student in 2014 in Roland Dyens' class, in 2021 in Aniello Desiderio's class and in 2022 he was a scholarship holder at the D. Cimarosa Conservatory of Avellino where he attended the second level Master's degree. Driven by a deep passion for the romantic style, in 2019 he recorded a solo album entitled Reverie, for the DotGuitar label, defined by News for Guitar as a journey into beauty through the various composers who are fundamental pillars of guitar composition. Simone, in fact, focuses his recording debut on some of the most important nineteenth-century guitar composers such as N. Coste, G. Regondi, L. R. Legnani and F. Tarrèga, to whom he adds one of the most important homages to twentieth-century romanticism: the Romantic Sonata (hommage to F. Schubert) by M. M. Ponce. He is the winner of over fourteen prizes in national and international competitions including: the Concurso Internacional de Madrid, the Città di Mottola international competition, the Andrés Segovia international competition, the France Music Competition, the Nilo Peraldo Bert international competition, the Alirio international competition Diaz. The recent collaboration with the composer Daniele Basini led him to record on behalf of the RUV (Icelandic National Radio and Television) and will lead him, in the coming months, to perform in Iceland, where he will perform the world premiere of a Sonata dedicated to him. Since 2016, he has combined his solo concert work with a significant teaching activity at state and private institutes, while he is currently a guitar teacher at the Don Milani Secondary Institute in Latina.
